

How to set up and use student accounts

Why should students have a LittleScribe account?

Once a student account has an account created, they have been provided with a purpose and an audience for their writing. They can use LittleScribe to transform their handwritten work into ‘for real life books’, and keep and record of all their micro moments of writing. The LittleScribe account enables students to publish their work into their own, private library, or once connected with a parent, they can share their work with family, friends and the world!

Students can use their LittleScribe account to:

- ✓ Create, edit and share their original, ‘for real life’ digital and print books
- ✓ Invite friends to share work in their Book Club
- ✓ Read their friends’ original books and leave comments and emojis
- ✓ Explore the Megabonkeramus library for a book by a new student author
- ✓ Keep an on-going record of their progress in writing

Keeping students safe online:

Students can only create a book and place it in their LittleScribe library, until a parent connects to their account.

Once a parent is connected, students can share their book with the world in the Megabonkeramus library and invite friends to their Book Club.

Student account details can be used for both the mobile app and the website.



How to create a student account

At school:

A student can be signed up by their school. They will receive their account details, and parents will be provided with a unique code to connect to their account.

Teachers, to set up your classroom, and create all of your students' accounts, simply email your class list to classroom@littlescribe.com and we will create your classroom and provide you with everyone's account details.

Once a classroom is set up, you can create a class library, leave comments and emojis on student work and view their progress in writing... through their books and through those micro moments of writing.

At home:

A parent can create an account for their child by signing up first as a parent, then linking their child to the account. You can also link your child to their school.

Student accounts can be accessed, and books created and published, using the same login details on mobile app and the website.
