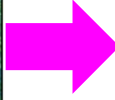
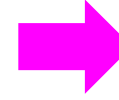


How to integrate creative arts with writing

Collect and photograph the amazing art work your students have already produced – they don't have to create anything new. This could be clay sculpture, paint, crayon or pencil pictures or mixed media collage work.

2.

Guide your students to tell the story of their work, or collaborate as a group or a class to tell a joint story.

3.

Design your cover pages and create your book using the LittleScribe platform.

Teaching Tips:

- ✓ Visual arts books could be used as a **'coffee table' book** – perfect for a fundraiser or an end-of-year gift.
- ✓ With older students, encourage them to **consider the text they are using as an art form**, to add a deeper dimension to the story being told.
- ✓ Use one of the images from the book as the front cover, and the blurb on the back cover can help you to assess student understanding and appreciation of art.
