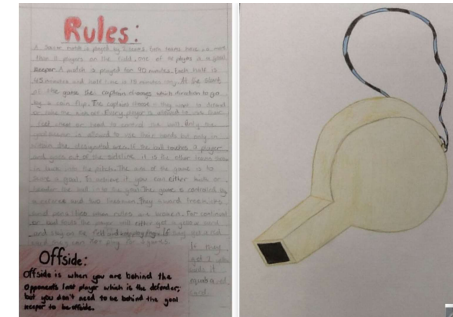
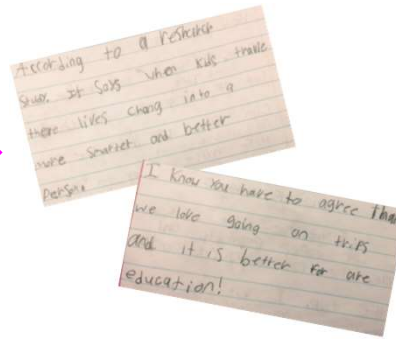
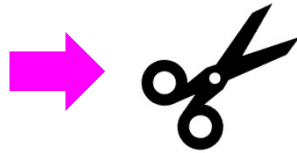
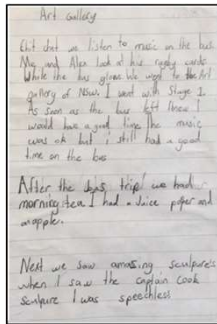


# How to use already completed writing to create a book

lit+escribe!



1. Choose and then photocopy written work from students' work books

2. Guide each student to cut their work into sections that will form the pages of their book.

3. Arrange the sections of the writing to tell a story, recount event, explain, inform or persuade. Explore how a different order can have a different impact.

4. Stick each piece of text onto a piece of paper and illustrate. Photograph and upload each page to make your book.

## Teaching Tips:

- ✓ The writing could be a recount in their journal, research or information they have written in history, geography or science, or it could be an imaginative story or an aspect of a narrative they have been working on.
- ✓ To take this one step further, particularly with older primary students, you can guide them to **evaluate and refine** their work as they go, collecting some **'micro-moments' of writing**.
- ✓ Encourage students to **highlight key words**, or place sticky notes on the page as they are planning their book. You can photograph their thought process and upload that into their library. That can become a record of their work, and they can later compare these initial thoughts to their final piece.
